Paterson Habitat's story continues 30 years of neighbors helping neighbors

From the very beginning, the story of Paterson Habitat has been the story of ordinary people doing extraordinary things.

That story began 30 years ago with our three founding pastors: John Algera, Stanley Vander Klay and Don Sherow. And over three decades that story has continued thanks to our donors, volunteers and homeowner families.

Milestone Anniversary

As we celebrate our 30th anniversary year, this community of caring people presses ahead with the challenge of helping low-income families achieve decent homes of their own at an affordable cost.

It's been an uphill struggle from day one, and the intensity of the struggle increases every year along with the need. But we also celebrate results.

30 Years & 300 Families

The "bottom line" of those results is 300 families helped in 30 years. In a city where 39 percent of children are living in poverty, in a state with the 4th highest rental costs in the nation, Habitat homes are empowering low-income families to escape over-priced and over-crowded rentals. Children are being raised in homes with space, light, working appliances and often, the luxury of a room of their own.

The greater our operating efficiency, the more we can help. So we're exploring new home designs that would increase the density of our building sites and the number of families with whom we can partner. (Continued on page 3)

Gearing up for the NRTC

The Neighborhood Revitalization Tax Credit is a highly effective public/private partnership model. Since being written into law in 2002, this tax credit program has resulted in \$70 million of direct investment that has led to more than \$300 million in additional funds for projects in 15 NJ communities.

The program provides a way for companies to redirect their New Jersey tax liabilities into support for nonprofits using a simple, one page application. The money is already being spent, so the NRTC is a win for everyone involved. Since its 2002 inception, 31 companies have participated statewide.

Paterson Habitat has been participating in the NRTC since its neighborhood plan was approved in 2013. Since then, PFHF has done projects that tie back to its neighborhood plan each year. Past projects have removed urban blight; revitalized neighborhood programs derailed by Hurricane Irene, and studied how to spur economic activity in the neighborhood. The 2016 project is being designed but, like the previous projects, it will propel the neighborhood plan forward.

In recent years we've also widened our focus to include revitalizing whole neighborhoods, along with community partners, as we're doing now in Paterson's 1st and 4th Ward. And we tapped into our entrepreneurial skills by opening the ReStore in Wayne, an ambitious fundraising asset and, incidentally, a great place to shop for bargains in gently used home furnishings and supplies.

Our greatest asset defies measurement. It's the conviction of our supporters that they have a responsibility as citizens for the well-being of their neighbors. Paterson Habitat has also always been an organization where people of all religious backgrounds can put their faith to work helping others. Challenge accepted...

In 2013, Paterson Habitat issued the following request of its supporters. "An anonymous donor has challenged us to raise \$100,000, to be used for property acquisition, and has contributed the first 30%."

The challenge was successful and resulted in just over \$102,000 to purchase 11 properties.

Ed Kopf: Retiring (sort of)...at age 89

It's not often that someone goes from his retirement party to an 89th birthday party in less than six weeks, but that's what Ed Kopf did this spring.

Ed's retirement party was in May capping 23 years as a Paterson Habitat construction volunteer. It and was followed by his 89th birthday June 18th. Even in an organization like ours that's powered by the efforts of over 2,000 volunteers a year, Ed Kopf's long volunteer career stands out.

He began as a weekend volunteer. After retiring from his job as office manager for an electrical engineering firm, he spent the better part of two decades as a mainstay of Paterson Habitat's weekday construction crew, where he typically reported twice a week.



"They're a good bunch to work with," he said of his fellow volunteers. "And we all learned from each other."

Ed has worked on hundreds of Habitat houses in Paterson, but he's shared his building skills well beyond the city. He discovered Habitat through Ridgewood's West Side Presbyterian Church, a longtime friend of Habitat, and for 23 years he went

> to Mexico every summer with a church group to build homes for poor families. He was also part of the first Paterson Habitat volunteer contingent to build homes in Kenya. His second retirement leaves him more time to enjoy his two granddaughters, but not all that much time. Ed still volunteers twice a week at West Side Presbyterian.

Dream team of Phil Dzialo and ADP

Despite the time and travel demands of his job as a division vice president with ADP, Phil still supports Habitatasamember of the Advisory Board, construction volunteer and regular speaker to a summer internship program run by Paterson Habitat and sponsored by the The Henry and Marilyn Taub Foundation. Phil's commitment reflects his own roots. He was raised in a single parent household by his mother in Kearny. They were renters at first, but Phil well remembers how hard his mother worked and saved to buy a home of their own and the pride the family felt in becoming homeowners. He sees that same determination and pride in our homeowner families.


